Lynne Bailey had the chance to see Mark in Charlotte a couple of years ago, and he gave an amazing demo and was very entertaining. She feels this is a great price for this demo and she hopes lots of you sign up. Mark throws "HUGE" pots and will be showing us his techniques. He lives within the NC pottery beltway and is well known for his large wood fired pots that marry with ash glazes and glass runs.

Mark and his work were featured extensively in the recent nationwide PBS TV series, "Craft in America," and he took part in two exhibitions of his big pots, the first, starting February 2010, at the Nasher Museum, at Duke University in Durham, NC, http://www.nasher.duke.edu/exhibitions_hewitt.php <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CDixGhX4r1O> and the second, started in January 2011, at the Ogden Museum in New Orleans.

There will be a welcoming party and slide show January 20, 7pm at Lesley Hildreth's house, 1704 Catherine Ct. VB, so please bring a dish to share. We would like to have a pot luck lunch at the workshop on Saturday.

Tracy Griffith Tso

Date: May 12-13, 2012

Tracie Griffith Tso began studying Chinese painting at age 12 and specializes in spontaneous flower-bird painting. The award-winning artist developed her style with a teacher schooled by a Hong Kong master. Among her traditional subject matters are bamboo, horses, magnolia, plum blossom, landscape, peony and Chinese carp.

A native Californian, Griffith Tso has taught and lectured about Chinese brushpainting at art centers and museums nationwide.

Outside of pottery and traditional ink and rice paper, she works on various creative mediums including tile, apparel and accessories and has incorporated the ancient art-form into professional graphics.

To work on pottery, Griffith Tso trades her ink and water for underglazes, pigments that are brushed on before adding a transparent glossy coat of glaze. Her unpainted forms are made by hand, either thrown on a potter's wheel or made from thin slabs of clay draped over plaster molds. Decorative etching and edges are finished and the underglazes are painted on before these greenware pieces go through an initial bisque firing. Designs are then coated with clear glaze and the outside is covered with colorful, glossy high-fire glazes. Check out her website [here](#).

Tracie will be bringing us a two day hands on workshop showing simple brush stroke movements that will make any picture easy to paint. We will start out practicing on rice paper where she will give us

the step by step brush movements, and then advance to bisque pottery using underglazes. This workshop will require pre bisque fired pieces, so bring as many as you would like to paint on.

Price for this workshop will be \$120/per person with between 12 and 15 participants.

MIXING SLIPS FOR PAPER RESIST

In the October 16th CDA meeting, attending members were treated to a demonstration using colored slips and paper resist to decorate pottery by Chris Stevens. During the demo, Chris forgot to mention her method for mixing the slip. So here it is: It is important to mix your mason stain, white clay, and water combination with an electric hand mixer, blender, or food processor (dedicated to clay use only). Ratios will vary depending on how intense you want your color to be. Your mixture should result in a creamy consistency.

COLD FINISHES ON CLAY

Barbar Kobylinska demonstrated just a few of the endless ways an artist can apply cold finishes in the November meeting demo.

For the sculptor, cold finishes on clay can be a wonderful way to finish. Here are some of the methods that Barbara talked about.

1. Acrylic paints
2. Oil paints
3. Spray paints
4. Inks
5. Wood stains
6. Rub'n'Buff for metallic effects
7. Wax pigments
9. Color pencils
10. Shoe polish of different colors
11. Patinas (out of acrylic paint, tre-wax and pigment)
12. Torched crayon wax
13. Washes of coffee or tea etc.
14. Textures
15. Stencils

Empty Bowls Spin-Off

I've volunteered at CDA Empty Bowls Dinner a number of times; three years I worked on the EBD committee as a chair. It was inspiring and gratifying to be part of the work CDA was doing with the annual EBD to improve community resources to help destitute people through their difficulties.

Back in my own community, something was missing. I live on the Peninsula. The funds CDA raises with EBD go to Southside charities. But we have needy people and hunger issues on the Peninsula too. A committee formed in March of 2011, we found a venue in May, and we've been working to pull together the necessary elements. We call our committee and our event "Empty Bowls Virginia Peninsula" (EBVP). Proceeds will benefit three charities that feed people in need on the Peninsula from Hampton to Williamsburg.

Our goals are the same as CDA's EBD but, because the venue is the Peninsula Fine Arts Center (Pfac), our event has a very different format. EBVP activities will take place throughout the Pfac galleries. We are recruiting restaurants and vendors to donate and serve soups, breads, and desserts. At this point our committee is eight people and several of us are wearing more than one hat. We even have our own [website](#). Wow, this is a lot of work!

I think everyone who has ever helped with CDA EBD can feel proud that the Southside event created the urge and the energy for an Empty Bowls on the Peninsula. EBVP is a spin-off of CDA's EBD.

Our first EBVP event is scheduled for Friday, Feb. 10, 5:30-7:30pm at the Peninsula Fine Arts Center, 101 Museum Drive, Newport News. Tickets are \$20 in advance; there will be a silent auction and a cash beer & wine bar. If you would like to attend EBVP, I will have tickets at the CDA holiday party and at the CDA January meeting.
